Course Content

This qualification is made up of two units: Understanding the Principles and Practices of Assessment (Unit 301 D/601/5313) and Assess Occupational Competence in the Work Environment (Unit 302 A H/601/5314). If you have already have the Level 3 Award in Understanding the Principles and Practices of Assessment, or have relevant professional experience, you may be able to achieve this award by only studying Unit 302.

During this qualification you will develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours to work as an assessor, and will cover:

- Functions of assessment
- Roles and responsibilities
- Standards and regulations
- Assessment methods
- Assessment cycle
- Planning and holistic assessment
- Involving the learner and others

- The VARCS principles
- Risks in assessment
- Assessment decisions
- Giving and receiving feedback
- Managing assessment information
- Quality Assurance standardisation, appeals
- Legal and good practice requirements

Delivery

This course is delivered virtually. You will attended an induction session and workshops, have regular 1:1s with a dedicated Assessor, and have observed practice in giving feedback to others.









Entry requirements

Employees who undertake this course should assess competence in a work environment, and can work with learners over a period of time to evidence the cycle of assessment and practitioner competence.

6-9 months


Who this training is for
